WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

1. Move as far away from the leak as possible. (This may mean the evacuation of your students to an upwind location.)
2. Avoid contact with escaping liquids and gases.
3. Call 911.
4. Call the toll-free, 24-hour Vector Pipeline emergency number at 888-427-7777.

WHAT NOT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

- **DO NOT** touch any liquid or vapor that may have come from the pipeline.
- **DO NOT** drive into the area or start your car.
- **DO NOT** light a match.
- **DO NOT** turn on or off anything that may create a spark.
- **DO NOT** operate pipeline valves.

If you do not know the location of the leak, shelter-in-place.

KNOW THE WARNING SIGNS

YOU MIGHT SEE:



- Dirt being blown or appearing to be thrown into the air
- Dead or dying vegetation in an otherwise green area
- A dry area in a wet field
- Flames coming from the ground or appearing to burn above ground
- Frozen ground when ambient temperatures are above freezing

YOU MIGHT HEAR:



A roaring, blowing or hissing sound

YOU MIGHT SMELL:



An unusual petroleum, skunk or rotten egg odor*

* The gas Vector Pipeline transports is not odorized but naturally occurring elements may produce an odor.

ALWAYS DIG WITH "CARE"

Call Before You Dig
Allow required time for markings
Respect the marks
Excavate carefully

All pipeline markers provide the name of the operator, the emergency number and the product being transported.
